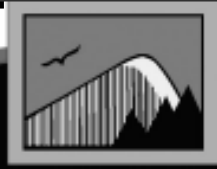

Tin Mountain's mission is to promote an appreciation of the environment among children, families, and adults.

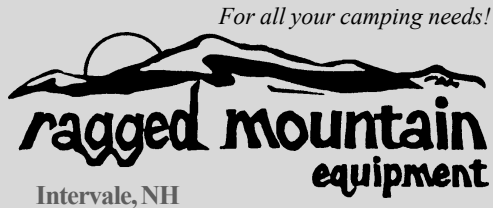
Entering its 26th year of summer camp, Tin Mountain continues to provide nature camp experiences for children ages 4 -16 years.

Among the many swimming opportunities are the Saco River at Weston's Beach and Lower Kimball Pond.

Frog Alley Farm, North Fryeburg

From the porch of Frog Alley Farm, campers are immersed in a summer landscape. Wildflowers grace the meadows of North Fryeburg overlooking the Presidential Range. The two ponds on site are home to a variety of frogs, water insects, and birds including ducks and great blue herons. A forested hiking trail invites exploration of local plants and animals.

Tin Mountain Field Station, Jackson

The original home of TMCC, the Jackson Field Station is nestled among the spruce and fir on the side of Tin Mountain. Its 228 acres include open fields, forests, trails, numerous ponds teeming with wildlife, and spectacular views of the White Mountains. Many short hikes include the old Jackson to Dundee Town Road, the trail leading to the historic tin mine, the path to "Pond Four" and the cellar hole, and the trail to the top of Tin Mountain. A swimming hole on the mountain-fed Ellis River offers the perfect place to cool off.

The Mountain Road, South Tamworth

Expansive views from the mountain meadows of our South Tamworth camp include Mt. Chocorua and the surrounding northern forest. This camp is located on old pastureland surrounded by hayfields, stone walls, and early succession forest. Footpaths lead to a swimming hole on Cold Brook and to the summit of Little Larcum Mountain.

Farm Camp, Nature Learning Center

Farm Sprouts Kindercamp and Farm Fun Discovery Camp are at the TMCC Nature Learning Center in Albany, NH. We have started our own small farmstead complete with vegetable gardens, flower gardens, berry bushes, and some animal visitors. We also will take a trip to neighboring Chase Farm to visit the horses, chickens, and frog pond.

Earle Family Farm, South Conway

Pigs, chickens, and sheep call the 140-acre Earle Family Farm home. Interspersed among the woodlands are 20 acres of organic farm fields, including the Earle Family Farm's famous raspberry patch and blueberry bushes. Crops range from carrots and tomatoes to snapdragons and cosmos. A separate children's garden, an herb garden, and the best frog pond in the Valley complete farm camp. The Saco River and Conway Lake offer excellent swimming opportunities.

TMCC Nature Learning Center, Bald Hill Road, Albany

Our Nature Learning Center is surrounded by 140 acres of woodlands with trails that lead to our five-acre Chase Pond, an historic granite quarry, Chase Brook, an active beaver lodge, and much more. The fields and gardens surrounding our 1800s barn and nature center teem with wildflowers, insects, and birds. We will swim nearby at Iona Lake.

REGISTRATION

Registration is on a first come basis. Receipt of registration form and deposit reserves camp spaces.

Make checks payable to: **Tin Mountain Conservation Center**

Master Card, Visa and American Express accepted.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Camp scholarships are awarded on a first come basis. Call or write for a scholarship application or check the box on registration form.

DEPOSIT AND REFUND POLICY

A minimum of \$50 is required for reservations. **Deposits are not refundable.** A full payment is required four weeks before camp. Cancellations or changes in registration must be made three weeks prior to camp session, no refunds will be made after this time.

CONFIRMATIONS

Upon registration, a confirmation notice will be sent. Detailed camp information and directions will be mailed three weeks prior to camp session.

TRANSPORTATION

Parents are encouraged to form carpools. A list of registered campers, addresses, and phone numbers will be sent to each camper.

OTHER INFORMATION

Each camper receives a free Tin Mountain t-shirt or hat. Additional shirts and hats may be purchased. Age appropriateness for children participating in summer programs are as of the opening date of the camp session. Our staff is certified in First Aid, CPR, and water rescue by the Red Cross and/or SOLO Back Country Medicine.
