Peaks and Paddles

June 24-28 Ages: 9-12 Time: 9:00am-4:00pm | Overnight: Thursday Enrollment: 12 M: \$350 | NM: \$400

We will split our time between hiking mountain trails and learning basic canoeing skills on quiet waters (with lots of swimming and other adventures as they arise). The week will be complete with an overnight at a local campground. *This camp fills very quickly; sign up early!*

Paths and Peaks

July 8-12 Ages: 13-16 Time: 9:00am-4:30pm Overnights: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday Enrollment: 10

After a local "warm up" day hike, we will set out on a four-day adventure, hiking and exploring the peaks and valleys of the White Mountains. We will spend the night and dine at the Appalachian Mountain Club's Mitzpah, Lake of the Clouds, and Madison Spring Huts. Previous hiking experience is required.

Crags and Canoes

July 15-19 Ages: 11-14 Time: 9:00am-4:00pm | Overnight: Thursday Enrollment: 12 M: \$425 | NM: \$475 After exploring the calm waters of the Mount Washington Valley, we're going to get up close and



personal with the rocks of the Granite state as we rock climb with a local outfitter. The week will be complete with a campout under the stars.

Peaks and Paddles 2.0

July 22-26 Ages: 10-14 Time: 9:00am-4:00pm | Overnight: Thursday Enrollment: 12 M: \$350 | NM: \$400

We're going to bring our traditional Peaks and Paddles camp up a notch with this adventure. Slightly steeper trails and new challenges in the water will add an extra thrill to the week. Of course the week will include swimming, games, and a night under the stars.



Girl Power July 29-August 2 Ages: 11-14 Time: 9:00am-4:00pm | Overnight: Thursday Enrollment: 12 M: \$350 | NM: \$400

With a combination of hiking mountain trails and canoeing quiet waters, this camp is similar to our wildly popular Peaks and Paddles camp, but with the twist of being all female. This is the perfect opportunity for the campers to challenge themselves and develop lifelong skills in a supportive environment.

Explorers Camps (cont.)

Canoe Voyageurs

August 5-9 Ages: 12-16 Time: 9:00am-4:30pm Overnights: Wednesday, Thursday Enrollment: 12 M: \$425 | NM: \$475

This camp is a paddler's dream! After two days honing our paddling skills on local waters, we will venture into the unspoiled wilderness of the North Country for a three day paddling adventure on Lake Umbagog camping two nights lake-side. Campers should expect encounters with moose, loons, bald eagles, osprey, frogs, and turtles. Previous canoeing experience required.



Camp Locations

Tin Mountain Nature Learning Center, Albany

The Nature Learning Center stands surrounded by 300 acres of woodlands complete with trails that lead to Chase Pond, a historic granite quarry, a beaver lodge and much, much more. Wildlife, insects, birds and wildflowers fill the fields surrounding the 1800's barn. Swimming will be at nearby Iona Lake.



Field Station, Jackson

Tin Mountain's original home, the Field Station is nestled among spruce and fir forests on the side of Tin Mountain. The 228 acres include fields, forests, trails and ponds plus views of the White Mountains including Mt. Washington. Trails lead to the old Dundee Rd, a historic tin mine, "Pond Four", a cellar hole and the top of Tin Mountain. A swimming hole on the Ellis River provides the perfect place to cool off.

Little Chatham Road, Fryeburg

Our beautiful post-andbeam camp building lies nestled among the majestic white pine forests of the 800-acre Burnell Family Forest. Here you'll also find cellar holes from the abandoned village of Little Chatham, vernal pools, wetlands and wildlife. Swimming is in the Saco River at Weston's Beach.

The Mountain Road, S. Tamworth

Expansive views from the mountain meadows of the South Tamworth camp include Mt. Chocorua, hayfields, and the northern forests. Our summer camp is located in an old pasture

complete with stone walls and apple trees. From here, footpaths lead to a swimming hole on Cold Brook and the summit of Little Larcom Mountain.
